## COMMON ARTS

## DRAMA

Drama classes will be a hands-on learning experience of working through the stages of putting on a play with the goal of a performance in March 2026. Each student will have a position in the cast as assigned. Note: students will be responsible for their own costumes, and parents are needed to help coordinate costumes, props, and simple sets.

Instruction in vocal health, singing technique and basic music theory as part of a larger choral repertoire structure, as well as an opportunity at attend Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra events as a group  
1 hour classes  
12 weeks / Fall Semester, plus one field trip to the PSO  
11 weeks / Spring Semester, plus one field trip to the PSO
